

STEPS FOR 3+1

1. Apply to Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ) and declare an eligible major.
2. For financial aid, complete the FAFSA and all other financial aid requirements.
3. Make an appointment and meet with a Counseling Advisor in Student Services.
4. Complete all requirements for the program of study (major) and maintain a 2.0 GPA.
5. The semester prior to graduation, meet with an advisor to complete the graduation petition.
6. The semester of graduation, contact the 3+1 Assistant Director to determine eligibility. If eligible, make an appointment for advisement and enrollment into the 3+1 Program. Appointments should be made around registration time.
7. Graduate from RCSJ with an associate degree.
8. Start the junior year through the 3+1 Program.
9. Continue to meet with the 3+1 Assistant Director for advisement and to complete the junior year at RCSJ.
10. Transfer to Rowan University and complete the senior year.

- An associate degree from RCSJ is required prior to participating in the advanced-level courses offered through the 3+1 Program.
- The FAFSA can be completed online at fafsa.ed.gov. The RCSJ school code is: **006901**.
- Criminal Justice Cumberland students must transfer to the Gloucester campus to participate in the 3+1 Program for the junior year.

- Students interested in the Nursing major must apply to and be accepted into the RN Program at RCSJ.
- Eligible students who are ready to graduate with an associate degree can make a 3+1 appointment online at RCSJ.edu/3Plus1.
