## Honoring Our Past, Celebrating Our Future

Fifty-two years after becoming the first community college in New Jersey to open its own campus, Cumberland County College marked another historic milestone. On June 28, Cumberland's Board of Trustees voted to close the college in preparation for the July 1 merger with Rowan College at Gloucester County.

The result was the establishment of Rowan College of South Jersey—one regional, dual-campus institution. The jointure of two community colleges is the first of its kind in New Jersey.

State and local government officials, administrators, educators, civic and business leaders, and members of the college community gathered to honor Cumberland's past and to celebrate the future of Rowan College of South Jersey.

"Joining these two schools to create one Rowan College of South Jersey is exactly the right thing to do," said New Jersey Senate President Stephen Sweeney. "The students and residents will benefit from increased academic offerings and the opportunity for a seamless transition into Rowan University. I applaud the leadership of Gloucester County and Cumberland County for taking the initiative to create more affordable access to higher education for their residents."

The jointure brings to Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ) more than 120 combined, unique degree and certificate programs—nine of which are fully online. With the combining of the two colleges, RCSJ students will benefit from more full-time faculty, more laboratories, and the potential for increased scholarship opportunities.

An innovative "3+1" partnership with Rowan University makes earning a bachelor's degree more affordable by allowing students in select majors to attend RCSJ for three years at the community college




rate, and then complete the final year of their baccalaureate program at Rowan University at the university rate.

RCSJ students also benefit from participation in the "Rowan Work and Learn" program that offers internships and stackable credentials to enhance work experience and career potential.

"The joining of Cumberland County College and Rowan College at Gloucester County marks an important milestone in the history of our state community colleges—the creation of a regional college in southern New Jersey," said RCSJ President Dr. Frederick Keating. "The merger of these two community colleges, in conjunction with an expanded 10-year premier partnership agreement with Rowan University, leads the way to a future filled with diverse and one-of-a-kind educational opportunities. Together these two campuses will provide students with a variety of degree selections, cost-saving initiatives, and scholarship and internship opportunities, at one of the lowest tuition rates in the state."

An important milestone was added to the history of community colleges in New Jersey with the merger of **Cumberland County** College and Rowan College at Gloucester County on July 1, 2019. On that momentous day, the two institutions came together to create one regional, dual-campus college. It is a great honor to serve as the first president of Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ).

Although the name of the college has changed, its driving force has remained the same for more than 50 years: Student Success. Together, the two campuses open doors of opportunity for students who will benefit from more full-time faculty, more laboratories, and the potential for expanded scholarships and internship experiences.

RCSJ students can choose from more than 120 combined and unique degree and certificate programs—nine of which are fully online.

An innovative "3+1" partnership with Rowan University makes earning a bachelor's degree more affordable by allowing students in select majors to complete their first three years at the community college tuition rate, and their final year at the Rowan University tuition rate.

An expanded 10-year premier partnership agreement with Rowan University leads the way to a future filled with diverse and one-of-a-kind educational opportunities. The "Rowan Work & Learn" program offers valuable internships and stackable credentials that prepare graduates to enter high-demand career fields.

The merger is projected to stimulate future economic growth for Cumberland and Gloucester counties with the creation of South Jersey's only EDs, MEDs and Commerce Corridor along Route 55 which, with our community partners, will offer academic, medical and workforce training programs.

I look forward to having you join us as we embark on an important and exciting journey to transform higher education and create more opportunities for students in South Jersey and beyond.

Students who earn four consecutive School Counts! certificates are eligible for a two-year tuition scholarship to Cumberland Campus. This year's event raised more than \$45,000.
