WHEREAS, the College has agreed to reclassify certain workers as employees while the DOL has agreed to accept the College's classification of the majority as independent contractors along with the College's agreement to remit annual unemployment contributions for these individuals from 2011 and each year thereafter;

WHEREAS, the College has agreed to pay, and the DOL has agreed to accept, the sum of \$12,912.33, representing monies from 2007 to 2010 in full settlement of the audit.

WHEREAS, the College's counsel in this matter has recommended to the College that it accept the resolution outlined herein with the DOL; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") has determined, consistent with the recommendation of its counsel, that it is in the best interests of the College to amicably resolve this matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as follows:

Section 1. The Board hereby authorizes resolution of the Audit under the terms set forth above.

Section 2. The College's counsel, Archer & Greiner, is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and/or review any necessary stipulations and/or other documents memorializing and effectuating said resolution.

Section 3. The Acting President of the College or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all documents deemed necessary by the College's counsel to effectuate this resolution pursuant to the terms set forth above, including remittance of the full payment of the agreed upon amount to the DOL.

Dear Mr. Wills:

Attached please find a photograph of a relief print done by the Countess Elizabeth Monath. She developed her own style by imbedding real objects under various types of metal, inking the surface and processing a print. I was the guest of Count Frederick and Countess Elizabeth on many occasions for dinner parties and spirited conversations dealing with art and the international market in Europe and the U.S.A. To say the least, these were fine occasions. I would place the framed value of this work at \$700.00.

Monath moved from her native Austria to Paris in 1930 to study art in a city artistically, vibrant with such talents as Picasso, Braque and Leger. The legendary Leger took Monath under his wing. Her work is in the collections of the British Museum, the United Nations Headquarters, Princeton University, the New Jersey State Museum and others. Monath studied at the Academy of Fine and Applied Art in Vienna, and the Graphische Lehr and Versuchsanstalt, also in Vienna. She studied with Fernand Leger and Amadee Ozenfant in Paris, and with Moses Soyer in New York City.

Elizabeth Monath worked in many mediums, including ceramics, oil painting and print-making, but was best known for the latter. When she was a student in Paris in the 1920's she won a national competition sponsored by Sevres for a sculpture. Monath wrote and illustrated children's books. The illustrations were original woodcuts and her publishers were Viking Press and Simon and Schuster. Some of the better known books were Topper and the Giants (Viking, NY, 1960) which was recognized by Eleanor Roosevelt who wrote a book review and The Other End of the String (Viking, NY, 1964). She also illustrated books by others, including for example Peter Rabbit Tales by the famous author Thornton Burgess (Little Brown & Co.).

Monath was a leading figure in the 1950's and 1960's in the Five Towns Music and Art Foundation (Long Island, NY), and served on the Executive Committee for many years and as chairman of that organization. She was instrumental in raising awareness in the community on art and brought many famous artists, such as William Dehn, to the Five Towns for exhibitions and lectures. She taught printmaking to many students, who came to her studio in Hewlett Harbor. In 1971 Monath moved to Princeton where she quickly rose again to prominence in the art community. She was very active in sponsoring shows at Princeton University, Squibb & Co. and many other places. She again taught printmaking to students. Monath had many shows of her own works at galleries in Princeton and surrounding towns, as well as in New York City where she had several prominent galleries exhibiting her work over a long time frame, including the Shuster Gallery. She exhibited at juried shows of the Princeton Art Association in NYC and internationally in Mexico and Vienna. A highlight for Monath was that in 1973 one of her prints ("Children of the Forest") was selected by UNICEF as the image for the annual UNICEF Christmas card.
