Oath of Office

Mr. Wos gave a report on upcoming events planned by the Student Government Association and introduced two members of the SGA executive team: Madison Mulcany, Treasurer, an Arts & Sciences major; and Amanda Odd, Public Relations Representative, a Computer Graphic Arts major.

ACADEMIC SERVICES

Dr. Brenden Rickards, Vice President of Academic Services, gave an update on the Middle States Substantive Change and discussed dropping the degree credit hour requirement to 60 credits.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ROWAN COLLEGE AT GLOUCESTER COUNTY TO RENEW ITS MEMBERSHIP IN THE GLOUCESTER COUNTY INSURANCE FUND COMMISSION

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2009, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Gloucester (the "County") established a County Insurance Fund Commission for the purposes provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the existence of the Gloucester County Insurance Fund Commission is intended to provide Gloucester County's various boards, agencies, authorities and commissions with the opportunity to combine resources to manage their liability and casualty risks and employee health insurance, as may be authorized; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:10:8 et seq. the County of Gloucester appointed three County officials to serve as Commissioners of the County Insurance Fund Commission; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the rules and regulations adopted by the Gloucester County Insurance Fund Commission, the commissioners shall be officials of the County of Gloucester and are authorized to perform all the duties as set forth in N.J.S.A 40A:10-10 and all applicable rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the various County boards, agencies, authorities and commissions shall have representation on the safety committee and the advisory committee established by the Gloucester County Insurance Fund Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Rowan College at Gloucester County (hereinafter "Governing Body") has determined it is in the best interest of the residents of Gloucester County for the Governing Body to renew its membership in the Gloucester County Insurance Fund Commission; and

WHEREAS, membership in the Gloucester County Insurance Fund Commission shall be for a period not to exceed three (3) years; now, therefore,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Rowan College at Gloucester County as follows:

Section 1. RCGC hereby accepts the findings that participation in the County Insurance Fund Commission will continue to result in cost savings and administrative efficiencies in the management of its liability and casualty risks and as may be authorized, its employee benefits to the benefit of the residents of Gloucester County.

Section 2. RCGC agrees to continue membership in the Gloucester County Insurance Fund as a participating member from January 1, 2018 through December 30, 2021.

Section 3. The Clerk/Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to publish and/or file any notices that may be required by applicable law.

Section 4. The Executive Director or his/her designee is authorized to execute any agreement, including an indemnity and trust agreement, or other documents required by the Gloucester County Insurance Fund Commission to effect the purposes of this resolution.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon the adoption and publication as required by law.

In accordance with New Jersey Statute P.L. 2015, Chapter 220, S485, supplementing Chapter 3b of Title 18A, enacted January 19, 2016 the President of each public institution of higher education shall report to the governing board of the institution, at each of its regular meetings, all crimes, fires and other emergencies which occurred on campus during the previous reporting period. For the purpose of this report Rowan College at Gloucester County is following the Clery Act definitions for reporting crime statistics.

 The Board of Trustees ("Board") recognizes that educational and professional conferences are of value to those attending and to the College. However, care must be taken to assure that such travel is directly related to and within the scope of the employee's current or projected work responsibilities.

Generally, conference attendance by employees will be limited to those meetings which do not entail overnight accommodations. Confirmations-Employees have the opportunity to attend same day, multi-day, or overnight conferences pending supervisory preapproval from the appropriate department. Employees requesting overnight travel for attendance at educational and professional conferences involving overnight stays must also obtain be approved pre-approval by the President. The Board of Trustees shall have the right to request a summary report from those attending the various conferences as to any information obtained.

The President is authorized to attend conferences and conventions which he/she feels are of institutional benefit and may approve for employees such attendance which in his/her judgment are uniquely important to the position held by those individuals. All overnight travel by the President will be approved by the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees.

There will be instances where attendance at special conferences and meetings by several staff members will be important and beneficial to the College and the individuals concerned. Authorization for these purposes will be made by the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees on the recommendation of the President.

Reimbursement of expenses will be governed by b Board policy and administrative procedures. The President will have procedures developed to implement this policy.

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It is the intent of this policy to avoid any situation where there can arise the appearance of

a conflict of interest.

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The College will not employ two or more persons concurrently who are closely related or residing in the same household in positions which would result in one person of such a relationship supervising another closely related person or having a substantial influence over employment, salary or wages, evaluation, or other management or personnel actions

pertaining to a close relative.

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For the purpose of this policy, "closely related" is defined to mean spouse; domestic partner; mother; father; sister; brother; biological, adopted, or foster child; stepchild; legal ward; grandparent, grandchild; first cousin; aunt; uncle; niece; nephew; mother-inlaw; father-in-law, sister-in-law; brother-in-law; daughter-in-law; son-in-law; grandparent-in-law; grandchild-in-law; or corresponding relatives of the employee's domestic partner; other persons for whom the employee is legally responsible; and anyone who stood in loco parentis (acting in place of a parent and assuming the parent's rights, duties and responsibilities) to the employee as a child.

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Closely related persons or residing in the same household will not be permitted to serve on the same search committee. Employees will be excluded from searches that could consider the candidacy of a closely related person or residing in the same household.

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No one will be released from present employment at the College solely because of a conflicting relationship who has been regularly employed by the Board prior to the inception of the relationship, the adoption of this policy or a Board of Trustee's appointment.
