

REGULAR SESSION MINUTES March 9, 2021

Chair Gene Concordia called the Regular Session of the Board of Trustees of Rowan College of South Jersey to order at 6:00 p.m., held via internet conferencing technology.

Meg Resue, Special Assistant to President and Board of Trustees, read the Open Public Meetings Act Statement: "In compliance with the 'Open Public Meetings Act' of the State of New Jersey, adequate notice of this meeting of the Rowan College of South Jersey Board of Trustees was provided by the forwarding of a notice on December 2, 2020, to *The South Jersey Times*, and *The Daily Journal*, the Gloucester and Cumberland County Commissioner Directors, Education Liaisons, Administrators, and both campus college communities."

Chair Gene Concordia welcomed everyone present for the meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For the President's Report Dr. Keating introduced Susan Nardelli, Special Assistant to the President, Institutional Advancement to explain the Service Industry Advertising Gold Winner Award the Communications and Marketing Team received for the College's Integrated Marketing Campaign – Online Classes at RCSJ, which was active during the pandemic. The holistic team effort was judged on consistent messaging thorough digital ads, social media, and video, managing to beat out competition from the likes of Comcast, Jefferson Radiology and Special Olympics - scoring front page coverage in the South Jersey Times. (award attachment)

The President noted that the Gloucester County Mega-site remains active administering vaccines and there is currently conversation for the Cumberland campus to provide this community service to vaccinate educators in Cumberland County. Governor Murphy was on the Gloucester campus this past weekend and he made the comment acknowledging that RCSJ was the only college in the state that took on hosting a vaccination mega-site.

Dr. Keating provided the Trustees with the background on the renaming of the Academic Building on the Cumberland campus and the Adult Center for Transition (ACT) on the Gloucester campus. The renaming of the buildings on both campuses was vetted by committee in compliance with college policy and appears under the Planning/Facilities section.

Dr. Keating provided a PowerPoint presentation providing the Board of Trustees with a synopsis of the 2021 balanced budget, the 2022 proposed budget, and the Chapter 12 budgets for each campus, once approved they will go on to the Board of School Estimate during the first week in April. Upon reflection if the Trustees needed further clarification after this evening please give Dr. Keating a call. He also noted, the College auditors were now engaged, however, the report was not ready to present tonight and will be presented at a later meeting.

Dr. Keating spoke to have a soft opening for July 1, welcoming back more staff returning to incrementally populate the campus. As more employees get vaccinated and he remains optimistic the campus once again come life with a safe hybrid return to campus opening for the fall semester. On a positive note, CARES stimulus funding appears eligible to aid back-up teaching labor, air quality control options, glass, doors, PPE, spacing, furniture, smart classrooms, and technology enhancement. As a cost saving measure, the college executed a retirement incentive plan which garnered over a \$1 million on Gloucester campus and about a quarter of a million on Cumberland campus in labor relief. We are still waiting to sort out if revenue loss from lost enrollments is eligible to tap from the 22 million in stimulus funding allotted to the college, but this remains unclear at this time.

Dr. Keating reiterated that the Board was wise to approve 1 year extension to the unions contract with a zero percent salary increase in December, but he asked the Board to be careful with that thought as we go forward, should we realize additional monies from the stimulus act that we never anticipated back when we created this budget last year – the college may come back to you to consider rethinking that percentage increase at zero and perhaps putting money into the increment, but time will tell if the federal money arrives, if at all.

The final aspect of the President's presentation was the review of the 10 key points of the college's reconstruction concept to facilitate building a new and better college for today and tomorrow. The reconstruction of the college will take time to implement, as well as strategically building enrollment. This could take potentially up to 2 to 3 years. (PowerPoint attached)

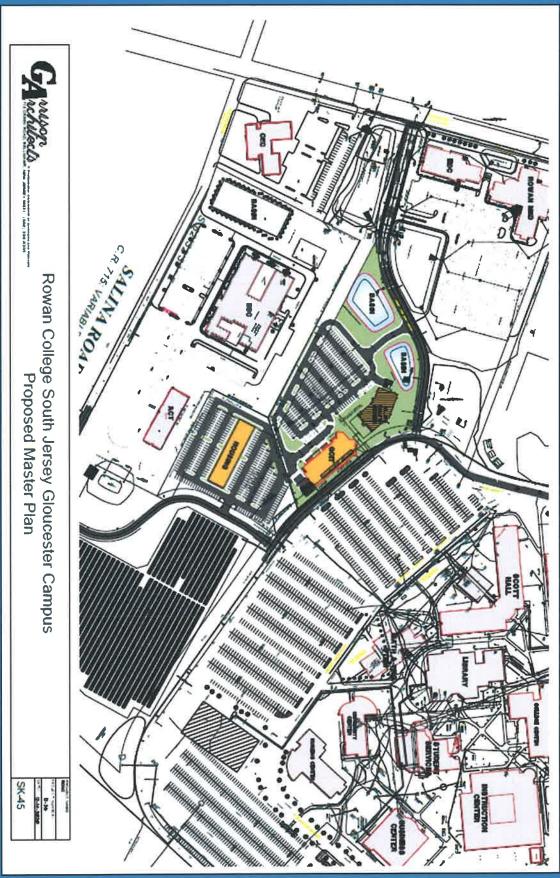

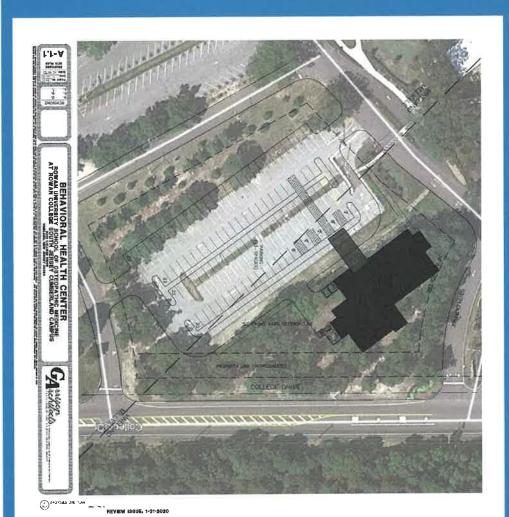

- (5) Liability insurance is mandated for all Nursing and Allied Health students. The \$50 assessment is a current estimate. The actual fee will reflect the actual pass-through cost of insurance.
