

REGULAR SESSION MINUTES May 5, 2021

Chair Gene Concordia called the Regular Session of the Board of Trustees of Rowan College of South Jersey to order at 6:02 p.m., held via internet conferencing technology.

Chair Gene Concordia welcomed everyone for the meeting and acknowledged Cumberland County Commissioner Deputy Director/Education Liaison Darlene Barber was in attendance this evening.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For the President's Report Dr. Keating discussed some of the items coming before the Board this evening. These items entailed the Gloucester County Mega Site and facility usage wear and tear re-imbursement, the success of Monday night's in-person commencement celebration with the 2020-2021 Commencement program of speakers, Dr. Hall and Mr. Burzichelli's modification of the Return to Campus Plan in advance of the September opening hybrid planning, capital project considerations, CARES Act funding utilization, labor unions reinstatement of the salary increment under the personnel actions, readying for the announcement of the launch of the Rowan Partnerships Online division. Dr. Keating then introduced Mr. Josh Piddington, Vice President/CIO for a presentation on the Rowan Partnerships Online concept.

Mr. Piddington provided a concise PowerPoint presentation on the concept and rational behind the design of the Rowan Partnerships Online division development (PowerPoint attached). At the end of his presentation, he asked for questions. Both questions were answered satisfactorily regarding continuity of course design in look and feel between Rowan University and RCSJ and WiFi connectivity for students without wifi at home. The answers were: Yes, there will be continuity of online course design for the specific courses within partnership agreement with Rowan University; WiFi connectivity is being looked at, at the county levels, particularly considering the Biden Administration's potential infrastructure package. In the meantime, the College continues to provide MiFi devices on loan to students without wifi access at home.

At the conclusion of Mr. Piddington's presentation, at the Chair's bidding, Dr. Keating acknowledged the thoroughness of the presentation and summarized the value of this addition to the College's academic profile. Dr. Keating indicated that with their straw vote the Rowan University/RCSJ partnership agreement addendum outlining the Rowan Partnerships Online would appear on the June Board of Trustees meeting agenda for formal approval.

ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES

FINANCE

Mr. Nick Burzichelli, VP &COO presented the informational financial statements and asked if there were any questions; there were none heard.

PLANNING/FACILITIES

Mr. Nick Burzichelli, VP & COO reported there were no crime statistics to report on either campus. He then moved on to introduce with explanation the other planning/facilities items for Board action. Mr. Burzichelli also discussed the CARES Act grant funding and how it may be used to cover revenue loss. He indicated that the College's auditors were auditing the finance team's accounting practices for funding usage to eliminate any potential misappropriation of CARES funds. Mr. Burzichelli let the Board now that the College's audit was late being completed this year due to the pandemic. The plan is to present the annual audit to the Board Finance Committee next week. With the Committee's approval, he would submit the report to the State by the deadline at the end of May with plans to present the final audit presentation at the June Board meeting. On a final note, Mr. Burzichelli provided an update on the Gloucester County Mega Site. The site will shutdown operation in the College Center and the Instructional Center as of May 17th, at which point the Mega Site will continue to operate out of the Business and Corporate Center with reduced hours through June 18th. A list is being developed of all wear and tear items for all facilities affected by the Mega Site, as it is understood these reparations will be reimbursable to the College.

ACADEMIC SERVICES

Dr. Brenden Rickards, Vice President, Academic Services explained to the Board that the individuals being approved for emeritus status this evening represent 155 years of dedicated service to our students' education and congratulated them on their many accomplishments over the course of their careers. Dr. Rickards continued his report and provided an overview of the new academic degree programs listed for approval, as well the various grants proposals with particular emphasis on the Offshore Wind and DVSR Center for Special Services grant applications, the result of a team effort across both campuses. Dr. Keating stressed that the wind application was big play in a big move for the College. He wanted the Board to understand that if the grant application is successful the College will have the notoriety of being the only one in New Jersey able to train people for the wind industry. This is particularly significant given the Biden Administration is moving aggressively to promote the wind industry on the East Coast with the state governor and our legislative leadership pushing hard for New Jersey to be a key player in East Coast wind industry development. Competition is strong; however, we are the only one with support from all the labor unions. The other grant Dr. Keating highlighted was the DVRS Center for Special Services grant application. This grant opportunity would facilitate the ACT program we have now along with DVRS and NJ Labor to build out a community college state-wide program so individuals with disability can become certificate trained at a community college, gain employment or participate in an apprenticeship/internship to build work environment relationships once they leave the program. These two grants were a ton of work by a lot of good people on our staff, but I feel comfortable we have a good chance with both.

Ms. Judy Atkinson, VP, GC Student Services, outlined the plans for the outdoor Parade of Graduates on the Gloucester campus. She explained how the recorded indoor aspect that included dignitaries, administration and student speakers on May 3rd would be spliced together with the May 11, 12, 13 and 14th Parade of Graduates recordings to form one overall commencement celebration for the Class of 2021.

PUBLIC PORTION

Chair Concordia asked Public comment:

Darlene Barber, Cumberland County Commissioner Deputy Director/Education Liaison congratulated the College on the commencement plans and those granted Emeritus status this evening for their years of dedication to educating our students. Regarding the WiFi concerns in Cumberland County, Duty Director Barber stated the county is diligently working on this concern. Commissioner Barber shared the title of the *Time* magazine issue: "The Lost Year" that contained articles on the plight of recent graduates on how the pandemic has changed a whole generation of students and the widening gap between students that were able to continue their education and those who had to defer due to family issues or other various responsibilities. She asked everyone to look it up online as an excellent issue. She asked about bridge programs over the summer to facilitate the re-engagement of the student body. Dr. Rickards indicated there were plans underway to do just that on both campuses.

Trustee Yolanda Garcia Balicki thanked the administration and staff for their efforts to provide the student body with a commencement celebration under such unusual circumstances. Not only do the students benefit from this acknowledgment of achievement, but the parents also get to celebrate with them after so much time, effort, and monetary investment.

Dr. Geraldine Martin, Gloucester Emerita expressed her gratitude to College and Board of Trustees for granting her emeritus status, as well as her continued love of the College.

- 3. Job Protection Guarantee: No unit member(s) will be subject to severance and/or interruption of employment via layoff, furlough, or reduction in force (RIF) thru June 30, 2022.
- 4. Other Terms and Conditions: All other terms and conditions contained within the 2017-2020 Collective Bargaining agreements and the 2020-2021 contract extension Memorandum of Agreement in effect beginning July 1, 2020, thru June 30, 2021, will be extended in full force and effect through June 30, 2022.
- 5. Non-Precedent Setting: This agreement shall not be used to establish any precedent or past practice; and

a. as a reasonable person should know, under the circumstances, will have the effect of physically or emotionally harming another student or damaging another student's property, or placing another student in reasonable fear of physical or emotional harm to his/her person or damage to his/her property;

b. have the effect of insulting or demeaning any student or group of students in such a way as to cause disruption in, or interference with, the orderly operation of the College;

c. create a hostile educational environment for other students at the College; or
