

REGULAR SESSION MINUTES June 8, 2021

Chair Gene Concordia called the Regular Session of the Board of Trustees of Rowan College of South Jersey to order at 6:01 p.m., held via internet conferencing technology.

Meg Resue, Special Assistant to President and Board of Trustees, read the Open Public Meetings Act Statement: "In compliance with the 'Open Public Meetings Act' of the State of New Jersey, adequate notice of this meeting of the Rowan College of South Jersey Board of Trustees was provided by the forwarding of a notice on April 5, 2021, to *The South Jersey Times*, and *The Daily Journal*, the Gloucester and Cumberland County Commissioner Directors, Education Liaisons, Administrators, and both campus college communities."

Chair Gene Concordia welcomed everyone for the meeting and acknowledged Cumberland County Commissioner Deputy Director/Education Liaison Darlene Barber who was in attendance this evening.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For the President's Report Dr. Keating turned over his time to Carol McAllister and Bob Nehila of Bowman & Company to present the College's 2020 Audit Report. They confirmed for the Board that the administration and staff were responsive and cooperative to get the report completed. It was noted that the 2020 audit was a little different this time due to being conducted over a year long pandemic and it was the first time the audit would be a consolidation of separate campus audits into one report with three parts represented: the main overall College, the Gloucester campus, and the Cumberland audits. The focus of the audit was to test how well the institution's controls held while the College predominantly operated remotely over the course of the year. All reports were filed on time and there were no material weaknesses or significant deficiencies requiring formal correction action. RCSJ was reported to be on financially stable ground with no findings. Dr. Keating noted how remarkable a clean audit was considering being only 7-8 months into the merger of two colleges and then heading straight into a historic pandemic. He thanked Carol and Bob for their work and guidance, as well as recognizing the work on the part of College's administration and staff.

ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES

The May 5, 2021 Regular Session Meeting minutes were approved as published.

FINANCE

Mr. Nick Burzichelli, VP &COO presented the informational financial statements and asked if there were any questions; there were none. He then went on to introduce the actionable item, the College's audit report as presented by Bowman & Company earlier on the agenda.

PLANNING/FACILITIES

Mr. Nick Burzichelli, VP & COO and Dr. Sue Hall, Dean, Nursing & Health Professions discussed the Return to Campus Plan. On physical plant side Mr. Burzichelli mentioned that effective July 5, the Governor, by executive order will lift many of the former pandemic restrictions. As has been the plan, the College will have a soft opening as of July 1st, and all Vice Presidents have been charged with re-populating both campuses through staggered shifts/days, social distancing and with appropriate PPE as needed. Mr. Burzichelli said he was a still sifting through the recently received executive order for more specific details. Any special accommodations requests from employees will be directed to and handled by Human Resources, but it appears RCSJ will definitely open for the fall semester.

Mr. Burzichelli noted the Mega Site is winding down with limited hours and will shut down its campus operation June 18/19 with a closing ceremony. From that point on the campus will be cleaned, repairs made, new furniture ordered to get the College back in shape for the fall.

On the medical side, Dr. Hall reported there were no direct transmissions of Covid-19 on either campus. She contributed that to great collaboration between the Gloucester and Cumberland health departments, Rowan Medical School, and the college community. Plans are underway to get factually informative literature out to the college community about and how to go about getting the vaccine. Additional communication took place at several student and faculty/staff college-wide town halls. The primary goal has and is everyone's health and safety. Mr. Burzichelli noted the Medical Task Force made up of a diverse group of administrators, cabinet members, faculty, and staff meets every two weeks to continue to discuss the restart plan as we head toward the fall semester.

Mr. Burzichelli went on to discuss the planning/facilities items on the agenda. He reported there were no crime statistics to report on either campus. Then as requested by Trustee Wills, he explained that most of the agenda items for action were standard annual purchases, but he pulled out some of the unusual or big-ticket items to provide more detail on the expenditures prior to the Board taking formal action.

RCSJ with this exciting partnership would be able to not only reach Gloucester and Cumberland county residents, but all of New Jersey, as well as across the nation with online certificate and degree offerings. Our College would be the only community college in New Jersey with this capability to offer a 4-year degree through the RPO.

STUDENT SERVICES & BRANCH CAMPUS - Commencement Recap

Ms. Judy Atkinson, VP, GC Student Services, described the outdoor Parade of Graduates a truly festive event. She stated how proud she was of our 2021 graduates considering what they had to go through to reach this goal and how meaningful it was for the College to recognize our 2020 graduates as well. She reviewed that on May 3rd ceremonial beginning and end of the

pomp and circumstance that was recorded. Over four days, May 11, 12, 13 and 14th, and was also recorded, the outdoor Parade of Graduates took place allowing students drive up, exited their vehicles, and walked across the stage to be acknowledged and photographed. Ms. Atkinson thanked the administration, faculty/staff and all the volunteers from both campuses that work so hard to make it a joyous and memorable event for RCSJ students. The complete recording should be available in July. Chair Gene Concordia having attended both the Gloucester and Cumberland ceremonies, emphatically stated that the logistics of the events were outstanding.

Dr. Jim Piccone, VP & CAO – Branch Campus, seconded Ms. Atkinson's sentiments and thought the success of the commencement ceremonies exceeded all expectations and it was because we had a great team and great plan. Dr. Piccone reviewed a wide range of graduation statistics to bring attention to the success and persistence exemplified by our RCSJ students despite the encumbrances of the pandemic. He thanked everyone that helped to make this event work and that the 2020/2021 graduates were appreciative to have the opportunity to celebrate this milestone.

To sum up the meeting, **Dr. Keating** noted several key College successes discussed over the course of the evening that he felt should not be lost on anyone. Despite a pandemic the College produced a clean audit, has stable fiscal footing, orchestrated successful commencement festivities, which is a testament to the academic controls put in place by our administration and the Academic Services team. We have served you as a Board and our two counties well. You could not find a better administration across both campuses. I could not have had a better group of people to work with and/or beside me to get through the last year and a half. Dr. Keating thanked the Board for their support throughout. While the College received some criticism for its conservative stance through the pandemic, the full Board played a supportive and excellent game. Dr. Keating stated the Board could not have been provided with better news on all fronts this evening and that he just wanted the work these people did, and they did while in the darkness of a pandemic recognized.

Trustee Yolanda Garcia Balicki wanted to reiterate everything said by Dr. Keating, Ms. Atkinson, and Dr. Piccone. Trustee Balicki mentioned her attendance at one of the outdoor Cumberland campus commencement sessions and how proud she is of RCSJ for the significant effort to celebrate not only the students but providing the parents and family members with an opportunity to celebrate as well. As an immigration attorney, she was moved by the cultural diversity of the students walking across the stage to be congratulated and acknowledged for their achievements.

PUBLIC PORTION

Darlene Barber, Cumberland County Commissioner Deputy Director/Education Liaison told Dr. Keating that the pandemic did not hurt him and is a great tribute to you and those who stood behind you on how you were able to meet the challenge. Commissioner Barber acknowledged and congratulated Mr. Burzichelli and his team for a great audit despite a pandemic, lost revenue, and found money. She noted how proud she is of the 93 Cumberland high school students who graduated with an Associate degree and was grateful of the hard

work that put this program together. Her last comment indicated her appreciation of the Rowan Partnership RPO addendum to get the College's online division up and running. Commissioner Barber thanked everyone for their hard work.

Chair Concordia asked for other Public comment: There were no further public comments.

ADJOURNMENT

At 7:09 p.m., Trustee Wills made a motion, seconded by Trustee Griffith. The motion was unanimously approved to adjourn the regular meeting.

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Students may be subject to criminal history background checks as they participate in College courses or for subsequent employment depending on the major in which they are enrolled or the employer who hires them upon completion of their college work. Students who are enrolled in programs for which they may not be subsequently employable, due to their criminal history, may be counseled to transfer to another major if the criminal record becomes known to the College.

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The College will cooperate with all institutions and agencies requiring such checks and will strive to inform students through regular sources, such as the catalog and handbook, of programs in which criminal history background checks may be necessary. However, due to evolving and new requirements for such checks, the College may be unable to provide all information necessary regarding every profession, institution, or agency requiring criminal history background checks.

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Accordingly, it is the responsibility of the student, not the College, to understand the requirements for such checks. All costs for background checks or other such reviews or activities will be the responsibility of the student. Details on necessary criminal history background checks for specific programs and the processes associated with them will be provided in the administrative procedure.

Placement Testing

The College requires all newly admitted students to take the College's placement test, the Accuplacer, or satisfy one of the exemption criteria. The Accuplacer places students in the appropriate level course, educational foundations, or college level course, based on current abilities in reading, writing, and mathematics. The placement test is taken after admission to the College, but prior to course registration. Students receive a copy of test scores and a breakdown of course placement upon completion of the placement test.

Educational Foundation Courses

As a result of placement testing, students may be placed into educational foundations courses. Educational foundations courses within the academic area must be successfully completed before moving into college-level coursework in the given academic area.

Testing Exemptions

 Students who demonstrate the required proficiency in English, reading, writing, and mathematics will be exempt from the requirement of taking educational foundation courses before entering their program and/or courses of study. Exemption standards have been established by each campus and are subject to change after administrative review.

Any student who previously attended C county C colleges at the Gloucester or Cumberland C campuses is qualified for academic amnesty if that student meets the following criteria:

- 1. Withdrew from Student had the College with a cumulative GPA below 2.000 or was otherwise on probation or academic leave when last attended the College;
- 2. Had f Five (5) years have elapsed since the end of the last term of last attendance and then returns to credit enrollment at the College;
- Needs additional courses to complete program requirements <u>Student desires to return</u> to the <u>College and complete a degree or certificate</u>; and
- 4. Has not previously been granted academic amnesty.

Academic amnesty is an option a returning student **must request prior to or during** the first year of readmission after the five year absence.

Under academic amnesty, courses taken five years or more prior to readmission will appear on the transcript, but only those grades of "C-" or better will be counted for purposes of determining the cumulative GPA and credit toward graduation.
