Students who have completed the program will be able to:

- Understand and use a variety of instructional strategies to encourage development of critical thinking, problem solving and performance skills.
- Evaluate how children learn and develop and analyze and reflect upon observed learning opportunities that support their intellectual, social and personal development.
- Locate, retrieve, and critically evaluate information and information sources.
