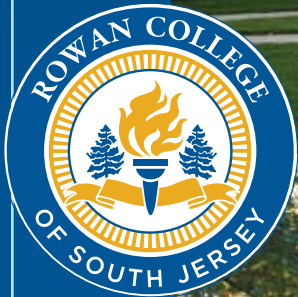

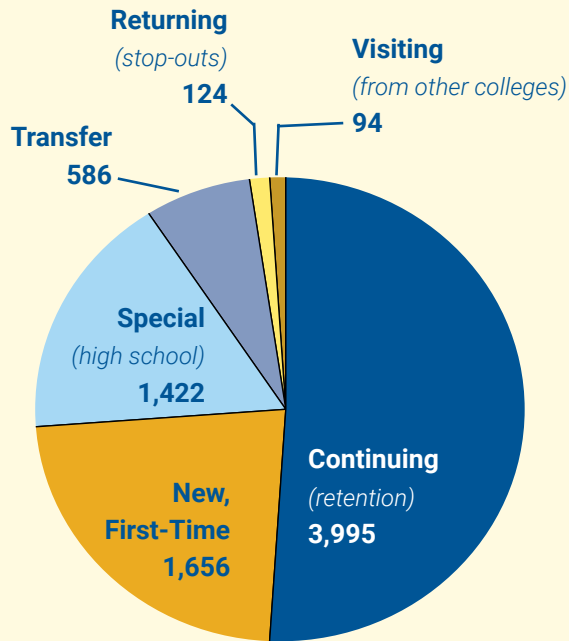

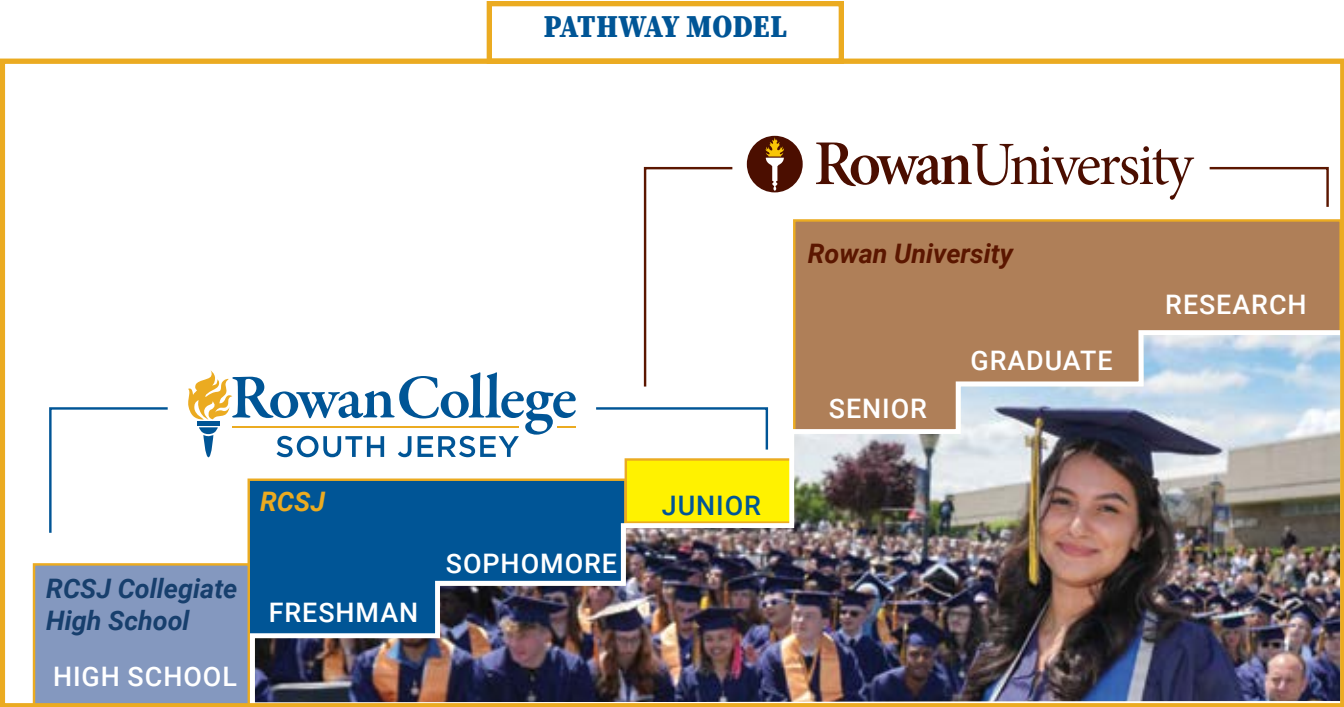

## THE ROWAN ADVANTAGE

RCSJ's long-standing relationship with Flagship Partner Rowan University continues to provide transformative opportunities for our students. This partnership guarantees acceptance to Rowan for those who meet academic criteria, creates cost-saving pathways such as the 3+1 Program, and expands access to on-campus living through Rowan Choice. Together, we are building a seamless pathway from community college to university-level success.



## Rowan CHOICE

RCSJ students live on Rowan University's campus while earning up to 60 credits. Courses are taught by RCSJ professors at both institutions, ensuring a supportive transition to university life. Available to all majors, Rowan Choice is particularly valuable to out-of-state Roadrunner student-athletes seeking both athletic and academic excellence.



## PARTNERSHIP PATHWAY PROGRAMS

### RCSJ Collegiate High School

This program empowers motivated high school students to earn both a high school diploma and college credits—or even an associate degree—at the same time. Offering small class sizes, expert faculty, and a supportive learning community, students are prepared for both college and career success.



### Traditional Transfer Pathways

Traditional Transfer allows students to complete their RCSJ associate degree before transferring seamlessly to Rowan University. This pathway maximizes credit transfer, minimizes costs, and provides students with the best of both experiences—intimate, affordable classes at RCSJ, followed by a vibrant university community at Rowan.



### 3+1 Program

Our innovative 3+1 Program allows students to earn a bachelor's degree for less than \$35,000—completing three years of coursework at RCSJ followed by one year at Rowan University. With 11 majors to choose from, the program delivers an affordable and accessible path to a four-year degree.



### Advanced Pathways

RCSJ continues to prepare students for high-demand careers through Advanced Pathways in Medicine, Engineering, and Veterinary Science. These programs offer early college credits, hands-on experience, and expert mentorship, accelerating students' progress toward advanced credentials while saving both time and money.

Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ) is committed to meeting students where they are by building a student-ready college that removes barriers to success. ### **PRINCETON UNIVERSITY TEACHING TRANSFER INITIATIVE**

Princeton's Teaching Transfer Initiative (TTI), a pilot through the McGraw Center, places visiting faculty at RCSJ to teach Princeton accredited courses and mentor transfer-bound students. Accepted RCSJ students enrolled in the Princeton-accredited courses at no charge and receive Princeton course credit, transferable to other institutions.





## ***Two Campuses, One Winning Tradition***

Rowan College South Jersey (RCSJ) fields two distinct intercollegiate athletics programs—Roadrunners at the Gloucester campus and Dukes at the Cumberland campus. Competing in NJCAA Region XIX and the Garden State Athletic Conference (GSAC), RCSJ supports a comprehensive, nonscholarship Division III athletics program of 28 sports teams across both campuses. The Roadrunners have earned national recognition, including multiple Learfield Sports Directors' Cups as the top junior college athletics program in the nation.



### **GLOUCESTER ROADRUNNERS**

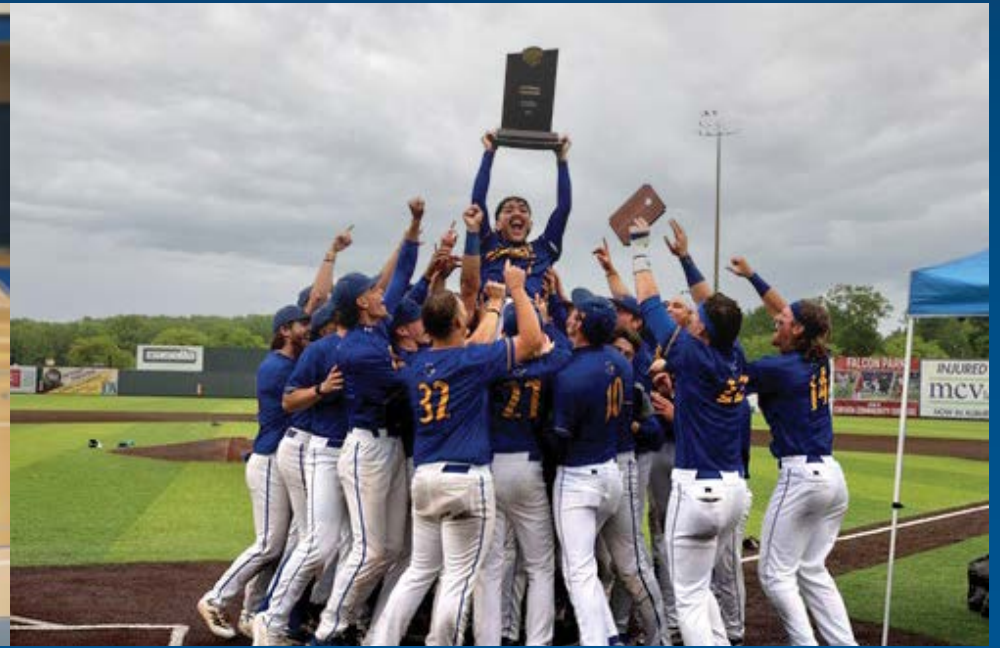
The Roadrunners compete in a full array of men's and women's sports including baseball, basketball, tennis, cross country, track & field, golf, soccer, softball, volleyball, and wrestling. They've captured numerous NJCAA Division III national championships in baseball (including three consecutive titles by 2025), tennis, wrestling, track & field, and more. The program has twice won the Learfield Cup—most recently in 2023–24—as the top nonscholarship two-year college in the nation. RCSJ is notable as the only nonscholarship program to earn that honor.



### **CUMBERLAND DUKES**

The Dukes represent RCSJ—Cumberland in NJCAA Region XIX and the Garden State Athletic Conference (GSAC), fielding competitive teams in men's and women's cross-country, track & field, golf, basketball, soccer, baseball, softball, and volleyball. The program has steadily grown in both participation and success, recently capturing a Region XIX Championship and expanding its reach with inclusive initiatives such as Unified Sports. The Dukes have a strong commitment to athletic excellence and campus engagement—fostering student-athlete development and school spirit through competitive athletics.







## ADULT CENTER FOR TRANSITION

First opened in October 2010 at Gloucester and now offered on the Cumberland campus, the RCSJ Adult Center for Transition (ACT) affords young adults with disabilities the vocational, academic, and socialization skills necessary to become independent and contributing members of society.

### ACADEMY FOR NEURODIVERSITY

The Academy for Neurodiversity was designed to function as a centralized service provider in Gloucester and Cumberland counties to guide, advocate, and locate resources for adult residents with special needs. It employs a strategic approach to connect post-high school adults with critical services across eight categories.

At the heart of the Academy is the belief that through awareness, access to appropriate resources, as well as educational and/or vocational opportunities, individuals with special needs will come to enjoy the same range of experiences as any member of society.

### SOCIAL ENTERPRISE

The Together Cafe is the product of a unique collaboration between RCSJ, SOM, RISN, and GCSSSD. Its goal is to create job training and employment opportunities for individuals with physical and developmental disabilities and to promote their inclusion in all aspects of community life.



## ***Our Commitment to the Community***

RCSJ provides community-based programs, as well as career-focused training programs for high demand careers.

### **FIRE ACADEMY**

The Gloucester County Fire Academy provides high-quality training in tactics, techniques, and safety through spacious classrooms and practical facilities like a burn building, aircraft trainer, and more. They offer mandatory and specialty programs by state-certified instructors, including customized training for emergency services, businesses, and industry.

### **POLICE ACADEMY**

The Gloucester County Police Academy provides advanced training and mentorship to enhance the skills of law enforcement officers and police recruits. Through a learning environment that highlights professionalism, integrity, and respect, the academy aims to equip its graduates with the tools to uphold the highest standards of law enforcement excellence. This commitment promotes safety and trust within the Gloucester County community.

### **ACADEMY OF YOUTH & ADULT LITERACY**

#### **High School Equivalency (HSE)/ GED Program**

The HSE program provides adults who did not complete a formal high-school program the opportunity to obtain a High School Diploma

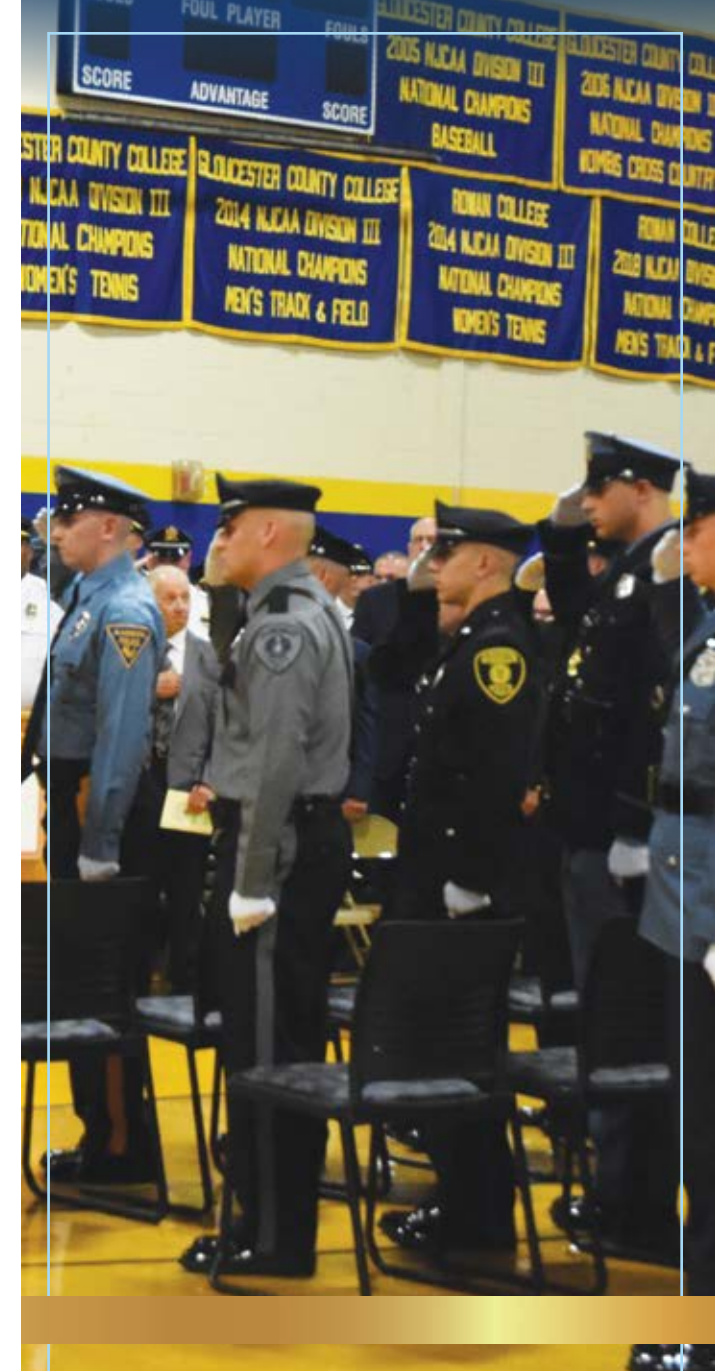
issued by the State of New Jersey Department of Education. Along with preparing students to take the GED assessment, the program also provides college information sessions, work readiness, and computer literacy workshops.

#### **English as a Second Language (ESL)**

The ESL program helps adults whose first language is not English to improve their English speaking, reading, and writing skills. Students will have opportunities to gain computer skills, work readiness skills, enroll in college, and prepare for career training or employment opportunities. Students may also choose to prepare for the US citizenship test.

### **CENTER FOR PEOPLE IN TRANSITION**

The Center for People in Transition provides specialized support services for displaced home-makers and people in life transitions, including: one-on-one case management, referrals to community resources, workshops on emotional support, life skills and self-development, financial and divorce workshops, computer literacy courses, and career training.

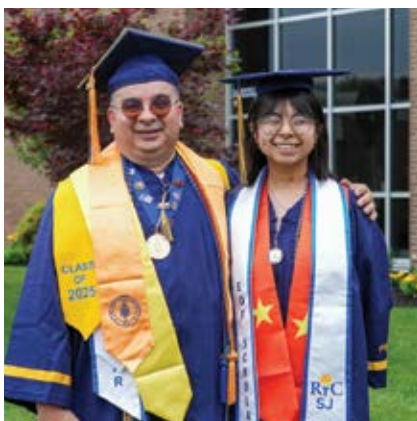

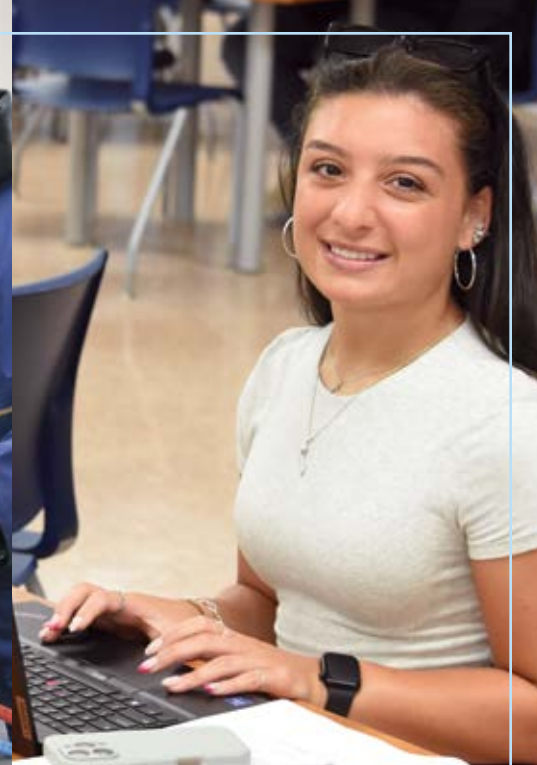
