Helpful Hints for Portfolio Submission

Fall 2023 Selective Admission Programs

This guide is to assist you with some common questions about the actual submission of your portfolio. It acts as a supplement to the admissions packet and the information session for your program of choice – not a replacement.

Strongly Encouraged	Try to Avoid
What type of folder should I use for my portfolio?	
✓ Large Manila Envelope	 x Bubble Mailers x File Folders x Binders x 2 Pocket Folders (even with prongs) x Letter-Sized Envelopes
What should I use to fill out Section III of my admissions packet?	
✓ Ballpoint Pen (black or blue ink)✓ Typed with handwritten signatures	 Pens with colorful ink Pencil Sharpie or other felt-tip pens
Where should I send the copies of my transcripts I'll use for my portfolio?	
 ✓ Mail to your home address ✓ Pick up in-person at your college or high school ✓ Do not open – keep in sealed envelopes 	 x Send to campus admissions office – will not be added to your portfolio for you x Printed copies of electronic transcripts (non-RCSJ) are prohibited
How should I print non-transcript documents I need to include in my portfolio? (Examples: proof of attendance email, proof of registration, unofficial RCSJ transcript)	
 ✓ Print from a laptop or desktop computer ✓ Use Word, Pages, or PDF format for required documents ✓ All contents are easily readable ✓ One-sided printing is preferable 	 x Screenshots taken from a phone, laptop, or tablet x Printing double-sided, if possible
How should I submit my portfolio?	
✓ In-person at your designated campus's admissions office	 × Sent via snail-mail × Electronic submissions are prohibited
When should I submit my portfolio?	
 ✓ After your Fall 2022 and/or Winter 2023 final grades post to your transcript ✓ Any time during the posted submission window ✓ After you've checked its contents multiple times and asked Selective Admissions for clarification (if needed) on required documents ✓ When it is totally complete per the checklists in the admissions packet 	 Rushing to "be first" – it will not give you an edge or boost in program admission After posted deadline (it's firm) If you do not meet one or more general or selective admissions requirements, please avoid submitting a portfolio for that year.
