- 6. **Humanistic Perspective:** Students will analyze works in the fields of art, history, music, or theater; literature; philosophy and/or religious studies; and/or will gain competence in the use of a foreign language
- 7. **Historical Perspective:** Students will understand historical events and movements in World, Western, non-Western or American societies and assess their subsequent significance.
- 8. **Global and Cultural Awareness:** Students will understand the importance of a global perspective and culturally diverse peoples.
- 9. Ethical Reasoning and Action: Students will understand ethical issues and situations.
- 10. **Information Literacy:** Students will address an information need by locating, evaluating, and effectively using information.
